The San Clemente Junior Woman's Club was organized in January 1948, and officially federated on May 7, 1948.

We have quite a record of accomplishments. Here are just a few:

- Raised money to purchase swings for the pier area, Ole Hanson Beach Club, and San Luis Rey Park
- Placed legislation on the San Clemente ballot to build SCHS
- Participated in "Community Pride Day" – painted park equipment and planted trees
- Raised money for and helped build Bonita Canyon Park
- Planted trees at San Clemente High School
- Started an ESL (English as a Second Language) Program in San Clemente
- Published the first community service directory for San Clemente
- Aided in reconstruction of the city's library
- Renovated and furnished the living area of a local battered woman's shelter
- Adopted a room in a local home for pregnant / unwed mothers
- Helped fund Courtney's Sandcastle, a playground accessible to all children
- Supports the local Family Assistance Ministry (FAM)
- Holds an annual Boutique to raise money for SC Elementary schools
- Sponsors the Summer Reading Program at the SC Library
- Donate fleece blankets to the Children's Hospital of Orange County

HOW MUCH OF A COMMITMENT IS IT TO BECOME A JUNIOR?

One of the best aspects of SCJWC is that the minimum time and financial requirements for membership are very reasonable and can fit into most schedules and budgets! In order to become a member, you start as a Provisional, which is a trial period for you to get to know the Club and for us to get to know you! The Provisional period is typically 3-12 months, and then you decide if you want to be initiated as a full member. Earning hours is fun and easy! You can earn hours for things you already do like volunteering in the classroom, shopping at Farmer's markets and even attending Membership & Federation events like mani/pedi day and happy hour.
